



OREGON, USA

Averaen Chardonnay

Wine: 100% Chardonnay harvested from 57-year-old vines. The vineyard itself is maintained through certified organic and biodynamic practices. The grapes keep their naturally occurring wild yeast to create a signature style of Chardonnay. It blends stainless steel aged wine with 10% new oak for a touch of depth and richness.

Region: Willamette Valley, Oregon has looked to its friends in Sonoma for inspiration, but with clay soils and cool weather, Chardonnay thrives without much need for oak influences.

Notes: silky, golden apple, fresh croissant

Pair: Whipped Garlic Potatoes, Lollipop Lamb Chops, Ultimate Slabz

SLOVENIA

Matic Pinot Gris

Wine: Pinot Gris is 100% Pinot Grigio. Just another name for the pink skinned grape. This producer leaves the grape skins in contact with the juice for 48 hours which in turn adds both color and flavor to this wine. With a slight pinkish hue this wine signals it's not like other Pinot Gris.

Region: Slovenia is a small country in Central Europe with a long and rich history of winemaking, dating back to the 4th century BC, when the Celts first planted vines. Matic uses dry farming, organic and biodynamic techniques to produce fascinatingly good wines.

Notes: lush, white cherry, watermelon

Pair: Skip A Beet, Mezze Board, Chicken Shawarma Slab, Chicken Salad Croissant

PORTUGAL

Quinta Monteiro de Matos Reserva do Paul Cabernet

Wine: 100% Cabernet Sauvignon grown in Tejo vineyards east of Lisbon, aged in wood for nine months, creating a structured wine with solid tannins and good aging potential.

Region: Tejo is one of Portugal's oldest wine-producing regions that lies on either side of the the River Tagus. Tejo is renowned for native Portuguese grapes like Touriga Nacional which is often blended with Cabernet.

Notes: structured, baked blueberry, spice

Pair: Lollipop Lamp Chops, Tomahawk Pork Chop, The Royale With Cheese Burger

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SPAIN

Freixenet Brut Cava

Wine: Similar fermentation and aging process as Champagne but not as sweet. It's bottled and cradled in chilled underground caves for 12 to 18 months. This family-owned producer hand-harvests the grapes across several months, awaiting the perfect time to gather each bunch.

Region: The vast majority of Cava comes from the Penedès wine region in Catalonia, near Barcelona. Spain is the world's second largest producer of sparkling wines.

Notes: easy bubbles, crisp pears and citrus zest.

Pair: Burrata, Seafood, Eggs Benedict Oysters

FRANCE

Le Coeur De La Reine Sauvignon

Wine: Old world wine from the Loire Valley in France. Produced by fourth generation wine-makers in the region of Touraine. Grapes are hand-harvested and gently pressed then fermented in stainless steel tanks.

Region: Touraine AOC is a sub region of the Loire Valley, one of the places where Sauvignon Blanc originated. The region boasts small yields, rich in tradition. Touraine in particular has various soil types, creating complex but high quality Sauvignon Blanc.

Notes: citrus dominate, a touch of pear with a mineral finish.

Pair: Lamb Street Tacos, Lions Mane Mushroom Pasta, Crab Mac n Cheese

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CHILE

Cousiño-Macul Unoaked Chardonnay

Wine: 100% Chardonnay. This producer introduced the region to Chardonnay, bringing vine cuttings from the world-famous French region of Burgundy. Sustainably hand harvested in place of machinery. This wine ages in stainless steel for 3 months, filtered then bottle aged for another month before it reaches the public.

Region: The Maipo Valley, located south of Santiago on the eastern edge of the Andes, is home to rocky soil filled with seashells and sand, thanks to the Pacific Ocean.

Notes: bright, honey dew, citrus finish

Pair: Chicken Salad Croissant, Chicken Shawarma Slab, Wild Lake Trout Slab

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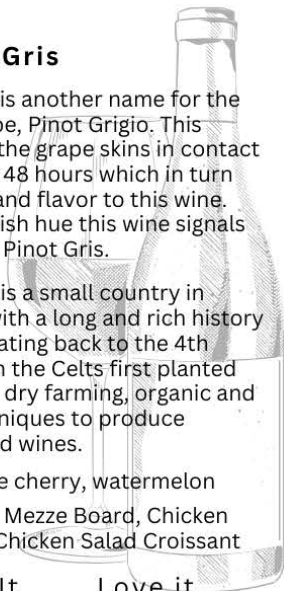
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CROATIA

Zlatan Otok Little Blue Plavac

Wine: Plavac Mali grape varietal, affectionately known as 'little blue' due to the grape's striking hue. Indigenous to Croatia and its flagship red grape. Relative to Zinfandel sharing the same parent grape Tribidrag from Croatia.

Region: From the coastal regions of Croatia, located on the east shore of the Adriatic sea. Viticulture began 3,800 years ago with the Illyrians, followed by the Greeks and Romans.

Notes: red raspberry, berry bramble, hints of smoke and spice

Pair: Saganaki, Mezze Board, Lamb Gyros

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ITALY

Lo Duca Wicker Basket Chianti

Wine: 100% Sangiovese grape with bright acidity and medium body. Served in a classic fiasco bottle, round bottom with straw basket, created in 14th century to keep bottles upright during shipping.

Region: The Chianti zone, is located in the central region of Tuscany. The Sangiovese grape variety produces a wine with high acidity and tannin, two important characteristics when aging wine.

Notes: tart cherry, dried herbs, sweet spice

Pair: Bucatini Carbonara, Lions Mane Mushroom Pasta, Ore Dock Broil Slab

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FRANCE

Mary Taylor Jean Marc Barthez Rouge Bordeaux

Wine: A signature blend of 50% Merlot, 25% Cabernet Franc and 25% Cabernet Sauvignon. It embodies the region's rural soul with dark-fruited complexity that make Bordeaux wines famous.

Region: Bordeaux is world famous for blending the 5 red noble grapes we know and love: Cabernet Sauv, Merlot, Cab Franc, Petite Verdot, and Malbec. Merlot thrives on the right bank of the Bordeaux in the clay dominant soil.

Notes: black cherry, dried figs, vanilla

Pair: Truff Burger, Two Cheese & Asparagus Sandwich, Washington St. Flank Steak Sandwich

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
